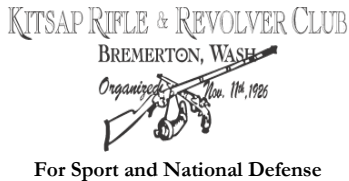

Here's what's going on at the Kitsap Rifle and Revolver Club in February:

- The Executive Committee will be meeting to discuss action being taken that affects the property our ranges sit on, and very likely, the future of our range's very existence. First, there has been illegal activity taking place on our property in the form of a mountain bike group apparently attempting to drive out all other users and encroach on the property we lease. We have even been contacted by a representative of the group telling us they are going to try to get the county to move us off the property. They have been cutting vegetation and trees, building trails and structures, installing culverts, putting up signs, and inviting people to ride out into our buffer area, all without the permission of the Department of Natural Resources (not to speak of being without any common sense either!). On Saturday February 21st we will hold a Personal Protection Level 1 class followed by a Personal Protection Level II class on Sunday February 22nd. Whether you are new to firearms or an experienced user, these classes always provide lots of information about the basics for firearms ownership including firearm selection, safety, the law, and fundamentals of marksmanship. The Reloading Straight Wall Pistol Cartridge class will take place on March 1st. If you have priced ammo recently, you know that the prices have gone through the roof! Learn how to reload your own ammo so that you can not only save money but also learn everything you need to know about the manufacture of ammunition. All of these course require registration and pre-payment so sign up today!
